Safeguarding and the Archbishop of Canterbury's Resignation 17th November There is a tragic irony that today is the CofE's annual 'Safeguarding Sunday'. It has been deeply unsettling to see the Church of England making the headlines for all the wrong reasons this week. The Makin report has laid bare John Smyth's heinous abuse of boys and young men in the UK, Zimbabwe and South Africa, and a catalogue of safeguarding failures by clergy and others who covered up what he had done at the time and in the Church of England's response from 2013 onward.

It is absolutely right that the Archbishop has belatedly taken responsibility, owning his guilt and shortcomings. One man's resignation will not bring about the deeper cultural change that is needed, but it would have been impossible for Justin Welby to be responsible for safeguarding in the Church of England. The moral authority of the church has suffered a devastating blow just at the time when we most needed it, with the proposed Assisted Suicide legislation now published and ready for debate in parliament. How ought we to respond to all of this?

Let's first remember the extraordinary gospel of grace. Jesus lifts us from the depths of our depravity and raises us to the heights of his holiness. With the assurance that He knows the worst about us, and yet still died for us; and the confidence that all who wear robes washed in the blood of Jesus will have the right to eat from the tree of life, we can be honest with ourselves, before God, and even before others, about our sin. How freeing that is! Rather than covering up our sin, let us commit to honesty, repenting and confessing our sins to God and seeking forgiveness and restoration.

Secondly, we ought to pray for those affected. For those who have suffered at the hands of abusers – not least those who have shared their harrowing experiences in the media this week. For those bearing responsibility for safeguarding in the CofE. For Justin Welby and his wife Caroline, asking that this would be the beginning of spiritual restoration for him, and for stabilisation of his mental health which he has been commendably open about. And finally, for our nation – that the Lord would open the hearts of those who have dismissed Jesus because of the sin of his bride.

And third, let us re-commit to properly discharging our safeguarding responsibilities at St John's – not because we are instructed to by the CofE hierarchy, but because proper care for children and vulnerable adults is an expression of Christian love, and part of our worship of the One in whose image they have been created. That is a responsibility we all share. As clergy we're thankful to Mary Kirkman for her hard work as our Parish Safeguarding Officer. If you have any concerns about the wellbeing of anyone connected with our church, or about our safeguarding policies and procedures, please speak to Mary, to Glyn or to me.
