Christmas Spirit 22<sup>nd</sup> December

How many times in the last few weeks have you heard people say how much they love Christmas? Quite a few I suspect. For some, getting into the Christmas spirit is all about buying and wrapping presents, or getting a new outfit for the party season, or stocking up the drink's cabinet. For many it's the anticipation of time with family and friends. For others it's the Christmas food. One supermarket is running with the strapline 'helping feed your Christmas spirit' - and some of the festive fare on offer is pretty bizarre.

I don't wish to be a killjoy but they couldn't be more wrong about the true Christmas spirit. It's all too easy to be drawn into the hype and Christians are not immune from "cosyfying" our image of Christmas to the depiction of the nativity scene shown on many Christmas cards. But the first Christmas was probably closer to the situation in Gaza that we have seen on our televisions over the last year. Dirty faced children playing in the muddy streets of refugee encampments; parents trying desperately to find a safe place to call 'home' and somewhere to buy food, toiletries or medicines; caring for the sick and vulnerable when there are few medical facilities.

We have many Christian brothers and sisters who will mark Christmas in dire situations similar to Gaza. It is an amazing work of the Spirit that there are Christian communities in countries where they experience crippling poverty, the threat of starvation, violence, warfare or persecution - Sudan, Haiti, China, Zimbabwe, Ukraine, Lebanon and Myanmar to name but a few. Despite this they continue to meet to worship and this year they will again celebrate the fact that God himself came to earth as a baby in Bethlehem, giving up the joy of heaven to be born in a dirty, unhygienic cow shed to a family who would, in a couple of years, be refugees in Egypt. I hope that we will all take time to remember our fellow Christians who may be imprisoned or alone; those who have no food (let alone M&S food\*), who may face daily violence. Praise God for their witness in difficult and dangerous circumstances and commit to praying regularly for one country where being a Christian is hard. Be thankful that we have a Saviour who has experienced the worst of human pain and hardship and will be with each of them and us day by day.

There is nothing wrong with enjoying some of the pleasures associated with Christmas. But the Christmas spirit is so much greater and more wonderful. The baby in the stable is now exalted to the highest place in heaven and promises life abundant to all who trust in him. Far better than Tesco's Finest or Sainsbury's Taste the Difference\*, Prosecco flavoured crisps or bubble gum infused gammon for anyone?
